This document is intended for all individuals who would like to be informed about the plans of the Ministry, as well as for those who want to follow the spending of funds in the realization of the set goals. I sincerely hope that this document will provide answers to key questions regarding the Ministry's Budget and encourage a greater number of stakeholders to express their opinions and suggestions, which will serve as the basis for preparing the Budget for Citizens in the upcoming period.

We are open to a more significant participation of citizens in the budgeting process in the preparation of the future 'Budget for Citizens' documents, despite the constitutional limitations in the structure of the budget of the BH institutions. We would like to create a more accessible and understandable budget, as this is one of the initial requirements for improving the management of public finances.

The money within the **budgets** of governmental institutions at all levels is the money of citizens. Governmental revenues are collected from citizens through taxes, various fees and charges. In addition to this, revenues also come from **concessions** for the useage of resources which make a common heritage and belong to all citizens. Even when revenues come from loans, it is the citizens who will ultimately have to repay them in the end. Governmental institutions are responsible for the funds within their budgets and they make decisions on behalf of citizens regarding the allocation of collected funds for different purposes.

Having in mind that the budget is a reflection of **public policies**, it is clear why the countries with a developed democratic culture have a significant interest of the public in many budget-related issues. Citizens want to know and to decide on how their money will be spent. The fundamental prerequisite for citizen participation in the budget decision-making process is their level of information. In line with that, the task of the authorities is to provide transparency of their work and provide information about all the important questions related to the process of creation, adoption, and execution of the budget.

The Budget for Citizens is a document that summarizes and explains the basic budget information. It is a report, presented in an accessible format, using simple and clear language that citizens can understand. If they can understand it, then they can achieve their civic rights in a democracy – they can ask questions making sure the government explains what they do in the name of citizens.



Budget

An act that predicts all revenues and expenditures in one year.

Concession

A permission of the government given to legal or natural persons to perform certain business activities according to predetermined requirements.

Policy

A plan or course of action by governmental institutions.

Budget for citizens

A simplified and illustrated outline of certain parts of the official Budget.

Area of work

- The Ministry carries out laws and other regulations through their direct application, resolving administrative matters in administrative proceedings, conducting administrative supervision, and performing other administrative tasks within its jurisdiction.
- The Ministry prepares and proposes laws, other regulations, and general acts within its jurisdiction to the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Parliamentary Assembly of Bosnia and Herzegovina and also performs other tasks specified by special laws and other regulations.
- The Ministry prepares and submits to the Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the Parliamentary Assembly of Bosnia and Herzegovina analyses, reports and information on the state of affairs in the areas and activities falling within the Ministry's jurisdiction.
- The Ministry monitors the state of affairs in the areas and activities within its jurisdiction, particularly regarding the enforcement of laws and other regulations, takes measures within its authority or provides recommendations to competent authorities for the enforcement of laws and other regulations.

Jurisdiction

The Ministry is responsible for:

- Principles of tax policy, fees and regulations;
- Relations with international and domestic financial institutions;
- Preparing contracts, agreements and other documents through which Bosnia and Herzegovina assumes loans and other financial obligations with other countries and international organizations;
- Planning and managing the debt of Bosnia and Herzegovina, executing international financial obligations;
- Policies for new borrowing both domestically and internationally;
- Preparing the budget of Bosnia and Herzegovina and the final account of Bosnia and Herzegovina;
- Coordinating activities to secure budgetary funds for Bosnia and Herzegovina;
- Executing the budget of Bosnia and Herzegovina and aging of financing for Bosnia and Herzegovina institutions;
- Conducting activities related to the succession of property of the former SFRY;
- Banking regulations related to the functioning of the Central Bank of Bosnia and Herzegovina;
- Managing property owned by Bosnia and Herzegovina institutions;
- Compiling, distributing, and publishing consolidated general government fiscal data;
- Coordinating international economic assistance for Bosnia and Herzegovina, excluding assistance from the European Union;
- Regulating internal control of budget beneficiaries in accordance with internationally recognized internal control standards, as well as providing guidance for the establishment and maintenance of internal control systems;
- Developing, managing and coordinating internal auditing in institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina;
- Financial planning for development in institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, including public investment management and medium-term planning, monitoring and reporting.

Legal Framework

The Constitution of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on Ministries and Other Administration Bodies of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on Administration, The Law on Civil Service in Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Labor Law in Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on Public Procurement of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on Financing of Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on Salaries and Reimbursement of Employee Expenses in Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on the Budget of Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on Internal Audit in Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on Borrowing, Debt, and Guarantees of Bosnia and Herzegovina, The Law on the Procedure for Conclusion and Implementation of International Agreements, The Agreement on Succession Issues of the Former SFRY, Financial framework partnership agreement between the European Commission and Bosnia and Herzegovina on specific arrangements for implementation of Union financial assistance to Bosnia and Herzegovina under the instrument for Preaccession assistance (IPA III).

BUDGET CALENDAR AND BUDGET PROCESS

The Budget Calendar is set out by the Law on the Financing of Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina and it defines the activities that are essential for the preparation and adoption of the Budget. It defines the timeline and responsibilities of individual institutions regarding the preparation and adoption of the official Budget.

Budget process is based on prescribed activities of all participants in the process of preparing and adopting the Budget of the institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina, as well as Bosnia and Herzegovina's international obligations, execution, reporting, and control.

Budget process begins in January, when the Ministry of Finance and Treasury provides budgetary instructions, along with a budget calendar, to all budget beneficiaries by the end of the month for the preparation of the Framework Budget Document (FBD).

Budget process

the process which includes the preparation and adoption of the budget, its execution, reporting and control.

Framework Budget Document (FBD)

A projection of three-year` revenues and expenditures or a med-term budget projection.



March 31

the Directorate for Economic Planning drafts macroeconomic projections for the current and the next three years.



The Ministry of Finance and Treasury of Bosnia and Herzegovina delivers budget instructions to budget beneficiaries with a budget calendar to prepare the FBD and the annual budget.

January 31



The Department for Macroeconomic Analysis of the Management Board of the Indirect Taxation Authority prepares a draft of indirect tax revenue projections for the current and the next three years. Budget beneficiaries submit priority review tables to the Ministry of Finance and Treasury of BiH

June 15

the Ministry of Finance and Treasury submits the Framework Budget Document to the Council of Ministers for adoption.



June 30

The Council of Ministers adopts the Framework Budget Document.



the Ministry of Finance and Treasury of Bosnia and Herzegovina delivers to budget beneficiaries the Instruction to prepare requests for next year's budget.



August 1

Budget beneficiaries submit requests for next year's budget.



The Ministry of Finance and Treasury of BIH, following consultations with budget beneficiaries, submits to the Council of Ministers of BIH the Draft Law on the Budget of Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina and International Obligations of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the following year.



October 15

The Council of Ministers of Bosnia and Herzegovina must submit to the Presidency of Bosnia and Herzegovina the Draft Law on the Budget of Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina and International Obligations of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the upcoming year.




the BiH Presidency must submit for the next year the Bill on the Budget of the Institutions of Bosnia and Herzegovina and International Obligations of Bosnia and Herzegovina to the Parliamentary Assembly of BiH.



December 31


The Parliamentary Assembly of BiH considers the Bill on the Budget submitted by the Presidency of Bosnia and Herzegovina, and adopts the Law on the Budget in accordance with its own rules of procedure.

The budget of the Ministry of Finance and Treasury of Bosnia and Herzegovina for the year 2023 amounts to **13,771,000 BAM** with the following expenditure structure:

The largest share of budget funds at the Ministry of Finance and Treasury of Bosnia and Herzegovina is allocated to Gross Salaries and Reimbursement of Employee Expenses (50%). The Ministry's functioning requires other expenses, including two multi-year projects:

- Project for upgrading the Financial Management Information System with the "Human Resources Management" Module and the "Centralized Payroll and Salary Payment" Module, with a budget of 1,200,000 BAM.
- Project for upgrading the Financial Management Information System with the "Budget Preparation Process Management" Module, with a budget of 855,000 BAM.

As a part of equipment procurement, the Ministry of Finance and Treasury plans to acquire two vehicles, computers, laptops, servers and network equipment. In terms of fixed assets in the form of rights, it is planned to procure checkpoint licenses, Oracle licenses and Ocean licenses.

The number of employees approved by the budget in the Ministry of Finance and Treasury of Bosnia and Herzegovina is 173.

COFOG classification

According to the COFOG classification, the total funds of the Ministry of Finance and Treasury of Bosnia and Herzegovina are related to General Public Services - Executive and legislative bodies, financial and fiscal affairs, external affairs.

COFOG CLASSIFICATION

The classification of government functions (COFOG - Classification of the Functions of the Government) was published by the United Nations Statistics Division and refers to budget funds classified according to the purpose for which they are spent.
